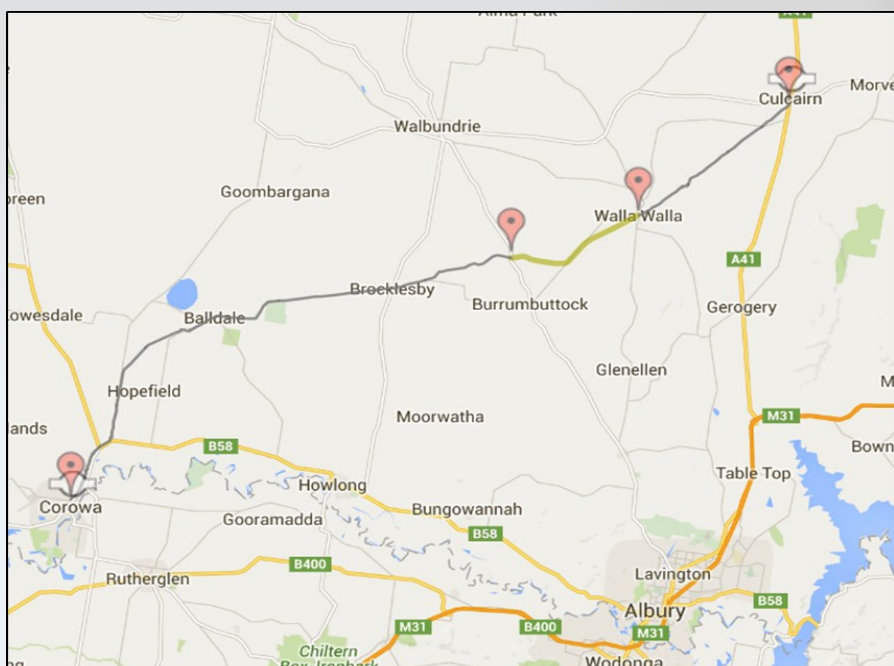




Culcairn to Corowa Rail Trail

With easy accessibility by road or rail the Culcairn to Corowa Rail Trail is in close proximity to the regional centres of Albury-Wodonga and Wagga Wagga. It is in a unique position being the only cross border Rail Trail in Australia. It will connect with the well established and popular Murray to Mountains Rail Trail in Wahgunyah, Victoria which is in the Rutherglen wine region. This 73km stretch of trail will take users on a tranquil journey showcasing the areas rich farming heritage with gently rolling hills of lush farming countryside. Ending on the banks of the mighty Murray River and home of Australian Federation in Corowa.



Services:

- Culcairn is serviced by the XPT Train service that runs from Sydney to Melbourne offering ease of access for Rail Trail Users.
- Accommodation, eateries and grocery outlets are available at both Culcairn and Corowa and meals are available at towns along the route.



What will the Rail Trail Offer the Communities Along Its' path??

What is there to see along the trail??

- See the historic Railway Museum at Culcairn located in the old station masters home
- Stop in at Walla and see the beautiful Zion Lutheran Church building built by the German families who travelled to the area in 1868 in a Wagon Train. A memorial to these pioneers is located close to the church. Then head to Morgans look out where infamous bushranger "Mad" Dan Morgan hid from police in the 1860's.
- Visit the Warraminna Environmental Education Centre at Burrumbuttock (bookings essential)
- Stop at the Avro Anson memorial at Brocklesby and learn about the amazing escape from a mid-air plane crash during World War II.
- Enjoy a bite to eat and a refreshing drink at the Corowa Whisky and Chocolate Factory or relax by the Murray River.
